- be free from spelling and grammatical errors.



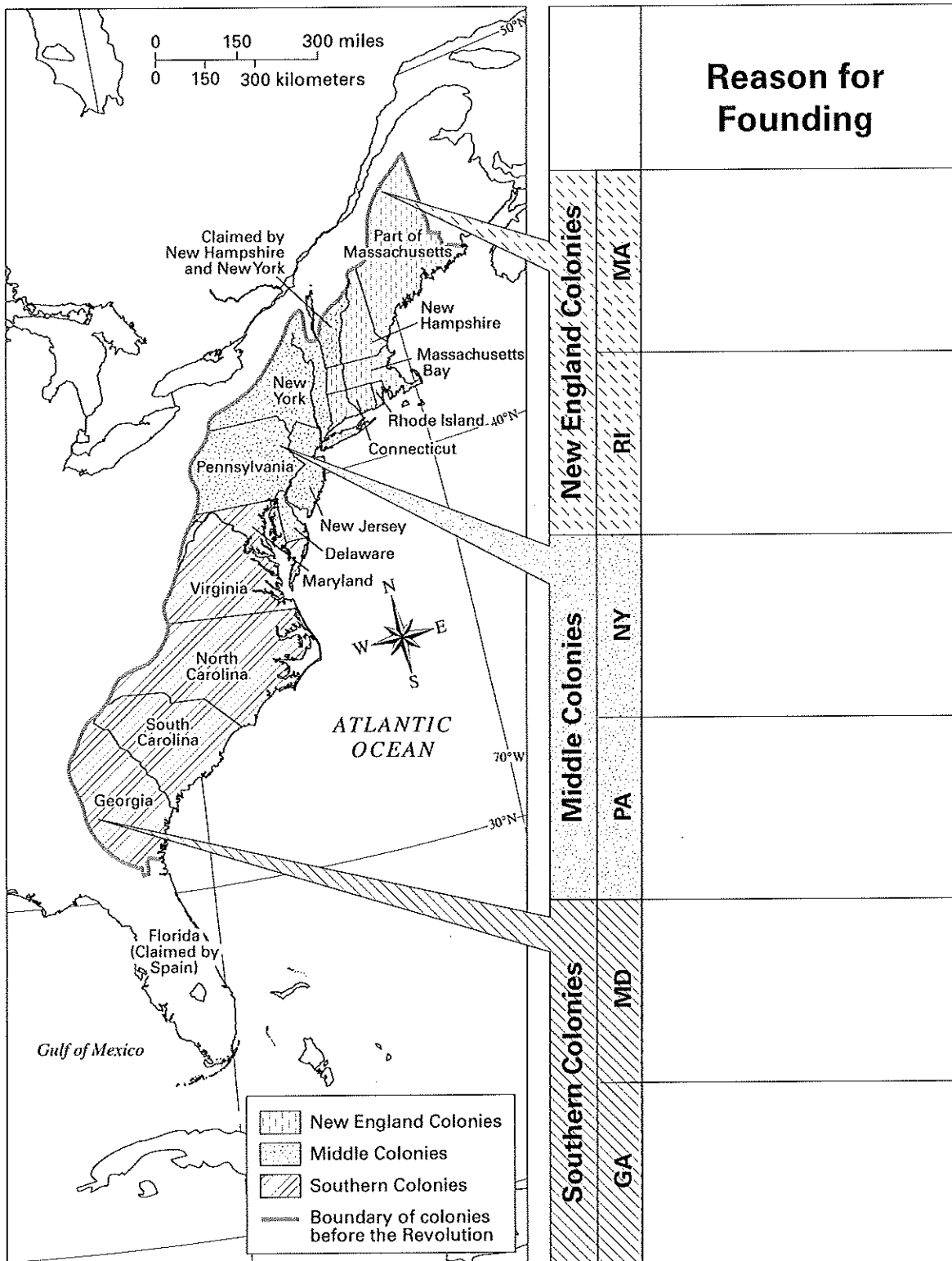
Draw a picture of a billboard you have seen.

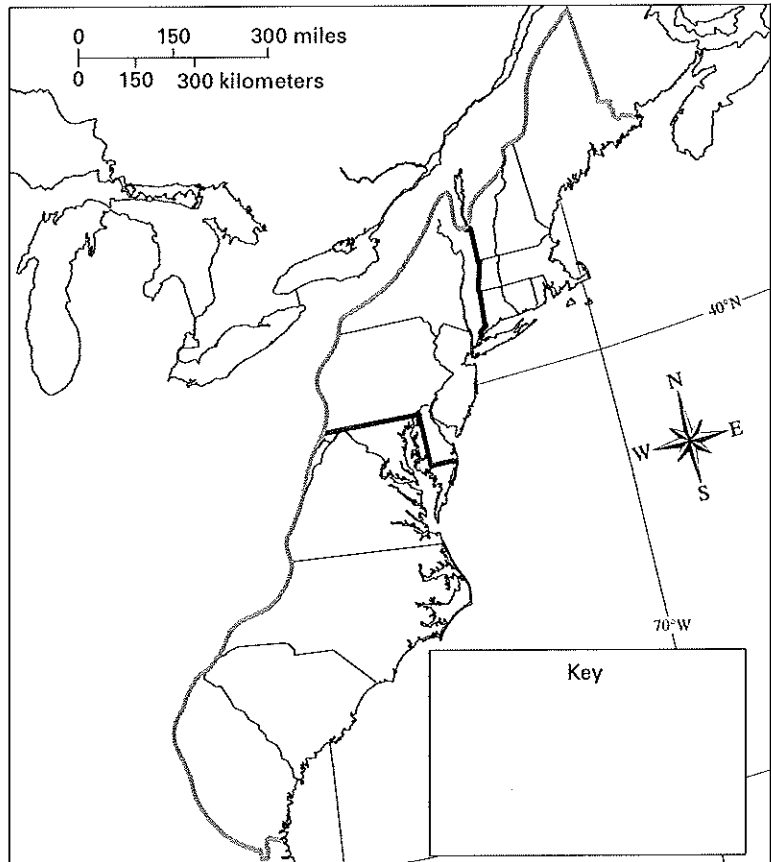
